

Is the new FT8 Taking Over the HF Bands?

QST editor Steve Ford, WB8IMY, suggests in the January 2018 QST that there is a new "killer app" taking hold of the HF digital bands. I agree with Steve Ford. I see and hear a distinct change in the dominant digital sound card based mode on the HF bands. There is an almost complete absence of RTTY signals (unless there is a RTTY contest) and there are fewer PSK31 QSO's. MFSK, Olivia, and THOR are only heard by me during NBEMS nets passing traffic with FLMSG/FLAMP. Once in a while I hear THROB on 80 meters. The Winlink modes (Pactor, Winmor, ARDOP, VARA) are set up to pass radio email between two linked stations (often unattended) and not used for casual keyboard QSO's. So what digital keyboard chat mode is displacing the very popular PSK31 which has been the dominant keyboard digital mode for the past two decades? The answer is FT8. FT8 qso's can be completed in under two minutes, and operate with far less power and simple antennas than RTTY, copying stations that are far below the average noise level. Occupying the same bandwidth as BPSK31 (50 Hz) FT8 is the optimum choice to get more stations into your logbook.

Contest Modes

With the advent of the ARRL RTTY Roundup contest on Jan 5/6 I wondered how many digi stations would be operating with FT8 rather than the more seasoned RTTY or PSK31 modes. The newest version of WSJT-X (V 2.0.0) modified the traditional FT8 modulation structure (now 77 bits replacing the older 75 bits) to allow use of FT8 for contesting (including Roundup and Field Day). However this means that earlier versions of FT8 are not compatible with the new version and will not work for contests.

I spent much of the ARRL Roundup this weekend comparing the numbers of RTTY, PSK, and FT8 signals on the 80m, 40m and 20m bands. To my surprise the FT8 signals were sometimes the dominant mode during the Roundup. RTTY stations tend to spread out over more than 30 kHz of each band, while the PSK31 and FT8 signals tended to clump into a smaller 3 kHz region of the digi band.

Below is an SDRplay RF spectrum (SDR Console software) of 40 meters captured around noon on the Sunday of the RTTY Roundup. I was looking at the dominant part of the 40m digital band, from 7050 to 7095 kHz. As clearly seen in the image, there were some RTTY stations (parallel tracks) around 7050 and 7065 kHz and above 7090 kHz. There were two distinct groups of FT8 stations: those above 7075 kHz who were probably exchanging non-contest QSO's, and those above 7080 kHz who were likely participating in the Roundup contest. The 7080 kHz frequency was suggested by Joe Taylor (K1JT) in the January 2019 QST. You can see that these are FT8 signals by the 2 second gap every 15 seconds in the waterfall display. I managed to make digital mode contacts on the following HF bands: 80,40,20,15,10,6 meters all with FT8 running no more than 20 watts to either a simple NVIS 80/40m center fed dipole, or simple vertical antenna. The 15 meter contacts were with stations in South America, but the 10m and 6m contacts were locals (also searching for DX).




Figure 1 RF Spectrum of 40m at noon on Sunday Jan 6 during the ARRL RTTY Roundup Contest

In Loving Memory of Alfred Tremont Tribble

Beginning of Life New Life Beginning November 5, 1930 January 27, 2019

ALFRED TREMONT TRIBBLE, middle child and son of the late Odessa and Alfred Tremont Tribble, Sr., was born on November 5, 1930, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. His older sister, Thelma Randolph preceded him in death. Al, as he was affectionately called, departed this life on January 27, 2019.

Al received his elementary and high school education in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Upon graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army serving his country with distinction from 1948-1952, and earning the rank of Corporal Tribble. Al fought valiantly during the Korean war and was injured during battle. For his heroism, Al was awarded the Army of Occupation Medal (Japan) Combat Infantry Badge Korean Service Medal with three Bronze Stars, and Republic of Korea Presidential Citation 2, Overseas Service Bars. Al discovered his passion for Amateur Radio while serving his country and is recognized worldwide by his call sign W3STW.

Upon completing his military service, Al sought higher education at Temple University. He continued his studies at Widener University earning a Bachelor of Science Degree in Electrical Engineering. On November 29, 1953, Al married his sweetheart, the former Justine Mills. This union of 65 years produced three successful children.

He relocated his family from Philadelphia to Bensalem in 1967 and immediately became active in the community. Al was elected and served as President of the Concord Park Civic Association from 1970-1974, and also served as Vice President from 1996-2002. Al was a voice for the community at civic association and township meetings. He along with Justine fought to ensure that private businesses seeking to establish roots within the community would enhance neighborhood curb appeal and property values. Al was also involved in the political process. In 2001, he was elected to serve a four-year term as Judge of Elections, a position he dignified and cherished.

In 2005, upon relocating to Ann's Choice, Al immediately sought an opportunity to introduce his hobby, HAM radio, to the Ann's Choice community. He established the first amateur radio station at Ann's Choice. His love of amateur radio compelled him to share his passion with countless residents, HAM radio enthusiasts, and Phil-Mont Radio Club members. He also worked in the ACTV studio and participated in various activities to include production of promotions designed to raise money for the Benevolent Care Fund which benefitted students.

Al had a distinguished professional career working for General Electric in the electrical and nuclear power generation fields in addition to the space program.

He leaves to cherish his memory, wife of 65 years, Justine Tribble, three children, Sharon Cooper, Alfred Tremont Tribble, Jr., Jason Elliott Tribble, daughter-in-laws, Claudette and Jennifer Tribble, grand daughter, Alexis Ashley Young, grandson-in-law, Joshua Young, great grandsons, Dillon Lawrence, Joseph Cooper, great grand daughter, Olivia Frances Young, brother, Bernard Tribble, brother-in-law, Gerard Howe, niece-in-law, Bridget Mahoney, nephew-in-law, Bryan Mahoney, nieces Diane Hayes, Arlene Gwyn, nephew, Leonard Lawrence, nephew-in-law, Charles Hayes, grand nephews, Kyle and Connor Mahoney, Reuben Fagan, Sharles Gwyn, great niece, Jasmine Lawrence, sister-in-law, Florence Lawrence, a host

of other nieces, nephews, relatives, HAM radio contacts, colleagues and friends.
