



## What IS Field Day?




Field Day is part educational event, part operating event, part public relations event and <u>ALL about FUN!</u>

From Wikipedia....

**Field Day** is an annual amateur radio exercise, widely sponsored by IARU regions and member organizations, encouraging emergency communications preparedness among amateur radio operators. In the United States, it is typically the largest single emergency preparedness exercise in the country, with over 30,000 operators participating each year. Field Day is always the fourth full weekend of June, beginning at 18:00 UTC Saturday and running through 20:59 UTC Sunday.

Since the first ARRL Field Day in 1933, radio amateurs throughout North America have practiced the rapid deployment of radio communications equipment in environments ranging from operations under tents in remote areas to operations inside Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs). Operations using emergency and alternative power sources are highly encouraged, since electricity and other public infrastructures are often among the first to fail during a natural disaster or severe weather.



Everyone is invited to come visit the Field Day site at any time during the activity. Please be advised we need night time ops. The ops during the day tend to fall off after dark and are back up for breakfast. If you can work at night coordinate with FD control by Cell or Repeater. We have a key to the Militia Hill Gate. We can let you in and out, but this must be coordinated with the ops at the FD site. The gate cannot be left open!!

#### AFTER HOUR ENTRY/EXIT TIMES (15 minute WINDOWS) 10:00PM - 12 MIDNIGHT - 2:00AM ONLY

If you are staying overnight ENSURE that you have enough supplies BEFORE THE GATES CLOSE!


Unlicensed persons, those with Technician Class licenses, or anyone who has not been on HF for over a year can operate on the HF bands in a low-stress environment at our Get On The Air (GOTA) station under the supervision and direction of an experienced coach.


Licensed operators are of course welcome to participate to whatever degree they feel comfortable.

Licensed operators are required to bring their license or a photo-copy in order to act as a control operator of any Field Day station.



### Here are some highlights from this month in Blurb history, June 1978.



#### TID-BITS

There is currently a project being planned the Navy, a research institution, and a magazine to attempt to locate the Titanic, which sank in about 12,000 feet of water on April 15, 1912. The exact coordinates of the sinking are not known, but the area is about 1600 miles northeast of New York City.

Search will be conducted using side-scan and profiling sonar; magnetometers, photography, and closed-circuit TV. When the wreck is pin-pointed it will be thoroughly explored and photographed using a submersible vehicle.


