


### The Prez Sez...



# Phil-Mont Mobile Radio Club Presents: PMRC Labs: Let's Get Digital

This was a hands-on learning experience focusing on digital modes for both portable and base stations. Showcased were: SSTV, FLDigi, and Packet Winlink. These exciting modes can be easily accessed using a simple dongle called the DigiRig, along with the appropriate cables for your radio or HT.





Thank you everyone who attended the PMRC Radio Labs In December! Let's Get Digital got digital and we were able to play with the DigiRigs, HTs, and some had mobile radios setup and other soundcard PTT devices. It was a lot of fun. We started briefly with SSTV. Then we moved on to FLDigi and sending in different modes within FLdigi. Ron, NY3J demonstrated CW and how to transmit pictures with FLDigi. We learned some of the basics of FLdigi and how it knows how to change modes on the fly. We created macros for checking into the NBEMS nets, checking the weather, and a few other fun things. We finished off the Labs with some packet fun. Greg setup a temporary Packet Node and some checked into the node and played with the BBS.

First timers with DigiRigs and digital modes were able to get vital hands-on first time experience. More experienced attendees where able to test their equipment portable with an HT.

Special thanks to Ron, NY3J, Steve, K3FZT, and all those who assisted with Labs and helping our attendees. Everyone came with different levels of experience and all learned and had fun.

- All participants must be registered with the automated logging system for contacts to be credited
- All contacts must be made on the designated amateur radio frequencies.
- Contacts must be via FM voice and can be either analog or digital (DMR, Fusion, D-Star).
- All contacts must be made during the event period. (00:01 January 1, 2024 to 23:59 January 31, 2024)
- Stations may only make contact with each other once per day on each designated frequency.

DMR, C4FM and D-STAR Simplex Frequencies are simply recommendations. Since some areas have pre-designated digital voice

simplex frequencies, they may use those frequencies as long as no external repeaters or other infrastructure is used. Simply

#### SCORING:

- When making a QSO, only one station will enter the information into the system. Usually the station calling CQ would
  enter the initial QSO information. Does not matter who submits the initial QSO info as long as the QSO does not get logged
  twice.
  - The other station will be responsible for confirming the QSO.
- Unconfirmed QSO will be credited with 1 contact point where a confirmed QSO will be awarded a value of 10 contact points.
- A QSO can be made with a station that has not signed up as a participant. However that QSO will only be award a single
  contact point. Should the non-participant sign up for the event after the QSO is made. The QSO made prior to their sign up
  will still be credited as a single contact point until the participant confirms the contact..

Encourage kids to get interested in amateur radio by giving them on-the-air experience. Share your ham experiences with young people. Call "CQ Kid's Day". Jax, KC3UFO, this one is for you.

ARRL RTTY Roundup - 1800Z Jan.6 - 2400Z Jan. 7 - 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 Meters - RTTY only - Worldwide. Rules: <a href="http://www.arrl.org/rtty-roundup">http://www.arrl.org/rtty-roundup</a>. Work any RTTY station. Try out the FLDIGI skills you learned on the DENN. Eligible for Phil-Mont club competition.

The lower power limit will give non-contest stations a better chance.

Good chance to pickup new states or Grid Squares on 6 Meters and above. Stations with multi-band capability will work a station on 6 Meters and continue onto the upper bands. There will also be Rover stations who will be at different Grid Squares as the contest goes on.

Lots of good contest activity while hibernating for Winter.


